

There are five ministry gifts in the Body of Christ. Their purpose is to build each of us up, so that we can DO the work of building up Christ's body, the Church. Each of us has a part! Each of us is needed!

These classes are designed to be reproducible. Use these notes and take what you have learned to teach others. As Paul wrote to Timothy, "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also." 2 Timothy 2:2, KJV. You can do this through one-on-one discipleship, home Bible studies, church youth groups, Sunday schools, or by starting a Believers School of Ministry in your area.

To prepare to teach these classes, go through each lesson and look up the Scripture references. Make notes on the side of each page and in the white spaces. INTRODUCTION TO BELIEVERS SCHOOL OF MINISTRY

"Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel. Now as he walked by the sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers.
